How To Use Your Genuair Device

Why use this sheet?

This sheet contains important information to help you use the inhaler device properly. Keep it in a place where you can find it. This sheet also indicates how the inhaler will help you and reminds you of how many puffs to take and how often.

How do I know when to get a new inhaler?

When you see a red band appear in the dose counter you are nearing your last dose. After your last dose the coloured button will stay in the locked position and a zero highlighted in red will appear. Take empty inhaler to your Pharmacy for recycling.

Inhaler Administration Steps

Prepare the device

- 1. Remove the protective cap (lightly squeeze the sides of cap to remove).
- 2. Hold with the coloured button facing straight up.
- 3. Press the coloured button all the way down ONCE and release (don't leave your finger there as it will stop the colour window changing to RED.
- 4. Check that the colour window is GREEN. Green means device is ready to deliver a dose.

Get ready to inhale

- 5. Breathe out, as fully as possible so your lungs are empty, away from the inhaler.
- 6. Place the mouthpiece in your mouth, between your teeth, and close your lips around it to make a good seal. Inhale strongly and deeply through the mouthpiece.
- 7. While you breathe in, you will hear a "CLICK" which means you are using the inhaler correctly, continue breathing in for a full breath after you hear this click.
- 8. Hold your breath for 5 to 10 seconds.
- 9. Breathe out away from the inhaler.

How to know that a dose was delivered?

10. Make sure the colour window has turned to RED. This means you have inhaled your dose correctly. If the window has not turned RED repeat steps 5-9.
